1. Absolutely not. They immediately wanted to defund the police over an incident that did not involve the LAPD.

2. The City Council is a prime example of being unable to police their own. Multiple City Councilmembers are arrested for crimes and they have the audacity to point fingers at LAPD. The rest of the City Council is completely useless, leftist scum. There, I said it. It's the truth. They back us in good times but throw us under the bus as soon as they have a chance. - 70. I worked as a SLO and I know the politics. And City Council needs us and they use us to help with their constituents. Especially when it comes to safety. Homelessness. Quality-of-life issues and what they send us to enforce and things they want from LAPD for free. To do this, it's clear it's an election year, and they have thrown us under the bus. I feel in less than a year, just like the cash overtime detail on 7-4 for fireworks, they will be back asking us to enforce

things on the down low. They need to make this job safe for their officers and make sure their constituents know that they expect the laws to be followed, and we will be their enforcers. To ask us to do it in private and in public make us the enemy only makes this job tougher, and it won't accomplish anything but get officers hurt.

Our Councilmembers get paid more than most in the country at an average of over \$200k. They can afford to take a day or two to ride with patrol officers.
- 85. The City Council are shills and corrupt and only care about themselves. Budget cuts do not affect their salary, but because of budget cuts, I will not longer be promoted on lists I prepared for and did outstanding on during the testing and interview process.

- 86. They stoke the flames of adversity and divisiveness. They intentionally put the lives of the public and officers into harm by condoning the behavior. With no consideration for human life, they let officers take actual bullets and never spoke out about that. They are liable for the visceral hate of law enforcement and any officer harmed in the line of duty within the city of L.A. They made officers feel abandoned along with feeling targeted for political gain.
- 87. I don't know who they think they are appeasing. Their proposals appear written by a high school dropout, facts are unsupported by data. Prager U would school them on what they consider facts.
- 88. They were the first to introduce our budget cuts. While we lay our lives and safety on the line to protect this city from burning down.
- 89. It's not popular to support us. We protect them when they're threatened by the people they support and instead of thanking us, they disrespect us.
- 90. The federal indictments of a current City Councilmember and a former City Councilmember has made me lose confidence in both the Mayor and the City Council.
- 91. No, they are bowing down to these protesters and taking our money away from our department. Let them respond to the calls and deal with the worst of society on a daily basis.
- 92. If they cared, they would increase the budget for extra training, not defund!!
- 93. City Council has (with some notable exceptions) abandoned their role as well. They are implementing policies that will devastate the communities that they serve. Sacrificing public safety on the altar of political expediency is the epitome of cowardice in leadership. They need to have the courage to serve their constituents and not pander to the lowest common denominator.

- 98. If anyone took a bigger knee during this entire time it would have to be the City Council, which knelt down and handed over the city to this anti/abolish/defund police movement and the BLM all because they shouted the loudest. During all the times I was on the streets during the "peaceful protests" I heard way more people praising us for the good job officers were doing rather then the few negative interactions that had occured outside of our city.
- 99. They are turning their backs on LAPD, except for Lee and Buscaino.
- 100. Many of the City Council have continually called upon officers to help them with problems in their community. The fact that they think armed officers are not needed to write tickets, respond to domestic violence calls or deal with persons suffering from mental illness is ridiculous. In one case, a Councilmember referred to officers as being brutal because of excessive use of force. I was personally offended by this, as I have 28 years with the Department and a stellar record. How would this same Councilmember like everyone to refer to him as corrupt for taking money, bribes, going to Vegas with call girls and engaging in prostitution?
- 101. With the exception of Councilmember Lee and Councilmember Buscaino. The rest are weak leaders who will do whatever the vocal minority wants. Councilmember Bonin was taking pictures in front of police cars and requesting more police officers in his district during his re-election. Now he's one of the main proponents of defunding.
- 102. Behind closed doors they have been very critical of protesters who protested at their residences, and they asked for police protection. Publicly, some of them are against us, yet they still want our protection at their residences.
- 103. Bunch of idiots except for Buscaino and Lee. Kudos to them for not kowtowing to the hypocrites.
- 104. They are puppets of the popular narrative.
- 105. Again, defunding LAPD will drastically increase problems with homelessness, mental illness, response times, etc.
- 106. Once again, 100% absolutely not!!!! The president of the Los Angeles City Council herself stated the exact same thing as the Mayor, that the Los Angeles Police Department officers are a bunch of "killers." This is unsatisfactory and makes me question why they were elected.

- 111. It's also clear that Council is only concerned with re-election. They have no integrity and do not care about doing what is right.
- 112. Misguided and uneducated on police work. Again giving in to the loud voices that represent a small portion of the community.
- 113. The City Council, at least most of them, are also clearly insane and being paid off by radicals. They have no idea what they are doing, and are out of control, damaging the infrastructure of our city beyond repair. This is not a matter of incompetence, this is anti-American decisionmaking, favoring anarchy over order. How are they not being driven out of their positions after so clearly
